

WHY CELEBRATE 2021?

THE REALITY:

Vulnerable children need our help ... and your generosity makes a difference.

Let's talk global pandemic.

COVID-19 has significantly increased the harsh reality for vulnerable children. In fact, one out of every four deaths due to COVID-19 leaves a child without a parent or grandparent to provide for that child's needs.

On top of the global orphan crisis, today's pandemic tremendously impacts the U.S. foster care system. During the COVID-19 outbreak, we saw more children entering foster care and fewer foster families available to provide a home.

Let's talk child welfare.

The 400,000 children walking the U.S. child welfare path face trauma, instability, and a lack of permanency. In fact, children in foster care experience two times the rates of PTSD as combat veterans. This is in large part due to the fact that the average child bounces between four different homes within their first year of foster care.

Caregivers are burned out. Children are negatively impacted.

THE GOOD NEWS WORTH CELEBRATING?

In 2021, you helped us work toward a better reality for vulnerable children. More specifically, your generosity allowed us to continue implementing a proven, nationwide model that mobilizes local churches to provide what children need most: **strong families.**





God promises to "set the lonely in families" (Psalm 68:6), and we're dedicated to joining this effort.

Promise686's mission is to mobilize church communities to care for vulnerable children. With over 672,000 children passing through the child welfare system each year, we know there's work to be done-and we can't do it alone. That's why we partner with churches to create and lead successful Family Advocacy Ministries (FAMs), with the goal of seeing every child in a safe and loving family, forever.

FOUNDING STORY

In 2008, a family's experience led to this journey toward caring for vulnerable children. After waiting seven years to bring their daughter home from Kyrgyzstan, their passion to see every child in a safe, loving family was undeniable. Promise686 began and since then, through our FAM initiative in churches, we've assisted 400 children coming home through adoption, inspired hundreds of families to foster, and prevented children from entering the child welfare system.



WE APPROACH THE CHILD WELFARE CRISIS WITH A 3-STEP STRATEGY:

1) PREVENTION

When possible, we work to prevent children from entering foster care.

In many cases, a house payment or grocery bill could mean the difference between a child staying with family or entering the child welfare system. When aware and educated, churches have the opportunity to help preserve biological families in crisis.

2) INTERVENTION

When neglect or abuse is involved, the state will step in. This means, it's time for the Church to *intervene*.

We help 1) raise awareness around the needs of vulnerable children, 2) recruit and equip foster families, and 3) support those caring for children in foster care.

Promise686 and our church partners are not equipped to determine whether a family is a good fit for fostering or adoption. That's up to the state. What we *can* and *should* do, however, is advocate for children who are at-risk and serve the families caring for them.

3) CONNECTION

We help connect children to families, forever.

Connection can happen through reunification or adoption. When a biological family is reunified, churches have the opportunity to provide wrap-around support, helping to strengthen that family. When reunification isn't possible, we provide grants and resources for families considering adoption.

FAMILY ADVOCACY MINISTRIES (FAMS)

Oftentimes, people and churches have a desire to get involved in the child welfare crisis but aren't quite sure where to begin. To alleviate the stress and confusion that can come with launching any new ministry effort, we've created a step-by-step ministry model, allowing churches to care for the vulnerable children in their local communities.

This proven model is called Family Advocacy Ministry (FAM) and is now implemented in more than 1,000 churches across the nation.

The FAM model helps bring about a positive impact in the lives of vulnerable children through:

- Praying diligently and consistently
- Raising awareness around the needs of vulnerable children
- Recruiting & equipping families to care for children who are at-risk
- Serving families in crisis through Care Communities
- Meeting physical and financial needs
- Providing grants & resources to the families working toward adoption
- Ministering to families to help meet emotional and spiritual needs

ULTIMATELY, FAMs HELP PROVIDE WHAT CHILDREN NEED MOST:

strong families.

A FAM STORY

Every FAM looks different and no involvement is too small. From providing weekly meals or supplying beds to raising awareness or hosting prayer meetings, FAMs make a difference every day in the lives of vulnerable children.

One Family Advocacy Ministry in Georgia is impacting kids in their local community by engaging in prevention, intervention, and connection! See the different ways God uses this FAM to help "set the lonely in families" (Psalm 68:6).

FOSTER CARE + REUNIFICATION

After recruiting and equipping two foster families to care for a sibling set of three boys, the FAM provided wrap-around support in the form of a Care Community. The lead Advocate fostered two of the three boys for two years while another family, supported by this same FAM, fostered the youngest brother.

The boys have recently reunified with their biological parents! The FAM is excited to continue serving in hopes of strengthening and preserving this family.

FOSTERING + ADOPTION

This same FAM supports a different family who began fostering at the start of the pandemic and is in the process of adopting a sibling set of three. Fostering is hard work and COVID-19 brings new challenges to families caring for vulnerable children. When FAMs step in to provide Care Communities, they help families to foster longer, providing fewer disruptions for children in foster care. In addition, two Advocates are nearing completion of the paperwork and home study to complete an international adoption. Praise God!

FOSTERING + SERVING

Lastly, the FAM supports a foster mom who is beginning her role as a Care Community Leader within the FAM, providing support for children and families in the local community. Care Community Leaders are critical volunteer roles within any Family Advocacy Ministry. They build relationships with the children and families served by the FAM and help push the mission of the FAM forward.

We love the amazing work God is doing through this FAM, as well as the 1,000+ FAMs across the nation!



CLINICS + ADVOCATES

We couldn't work toward this mission of caring for vulnerable children without the **1,346 Advocates** leading Family Advocacy Ministries across the nation.

Through the generosity of our donors, Promise provides the training, resources, and guidance needed to empower church leaders, ministry leaders, and volunteers to set up and maintain successful FAMs.

In 2021, along with our nonprofit partners, we hosted **16 Clinics**, training **437 Advocates** to implement and lead new FAMs.

We're incredibly grateful for the impact Advocates have on their church volunteers, the families they're serving, and the local community.

CAREPORTAL

Promise686 implements CarePortal in Georgia, a tool to help churches care for vulnerable children by meeting the needs of families in crisis.

CarePortal is a technological platform that has served 115,634 children.

Via a simple email request, CarePortal provides entry-level opportunities to connect a network of caring people in churches to the physical needs of families in their community. This network can provide *preventative* support for struggling families before foster care is a necessity. When the intervention of foster care does become a necessity, CarePortal also supports the foster families who are welcoming these children.

Currently, 113 churches in Georgia are using the CarePortal tool, through their FAMs, to serve local children.

By meeting tangible needs ...

CARE COMMUNITIES

When churches recruit a new foster or adoptive family, or become aware of a local family in crisis, the next step is to provide that family with a strong support system.

Traditionally, over 50% of foster parents drop out of the system within their first year of fostering. When foster families are surrounded by strong Care Communities, however, 90% will continue fostering after one year.

Care Communities create the opportunity to be the hands and feet of Jesus by serving families who are caring for vulnerable children with meals, babysitting, prayer, and much more. FAMs increase the number of Care Communities for families across the United States, and ultimately, help raise kids who are at-risk in safe, loving homes.





Since we began in 2007, Promise686 has awarded over \$3.5 million, helping over **400** children & families connect for a lifetime. We've awarded over **\$200,860** in adoption grants this year.

PROMISE SERVES

In order to support children and families most effectively, FAMs utilize Promise Serves, a software platform we built in-house to serve our Affiliate and church partners. This tool is designed to meet the custom needs of a Family Advocacy Ministry. Promise Serves minimizes the burden that many times comes along with serving by decreasing the amount of admin work for our Advocates and increasing the longevity of church volunteers.

Since we've launched Promise Serves, over **1,100 churches** have used this tool to serve vulnerable children across the country.

NEW FEATURES IN 2021

Since its creation, Promise Serves has been known for its core features like "best matching" volunteers with nearby families, administrative tools, and multi-campus church capabilities.

In 2021, we added additional features to further serve our Affiliates and Advocates, like:

- Global search functionality
- A revamped, user-friendly resources section
- Advocate Forum discussion board
- FAM activity support
- Mapping support
- Contact log and notes capabilities
- And more!



THE PROMISE NETWORK

The 400,000 children in U.S. foster care are immensely underserved. To care for these children, we recognize the need for collaboration and work diligently to build partnerships with others working toward our same vision. We know that together, we can make a greater impact.

This partnership is called The Promise Network: a group of churches and organizations nationwide that are committed to living the promise God makes in Psalm 68:6 "to set the lonely in families." As part of The Promise Network, our partners receive training, resources, and ongoing staff support from Promise686.

Because of our generous donors, we were able to continue mobilizing churches in 2021, growing The Promise Network to 1,017 CHURCHES NATIONWIDE.

While we currently serve 313 CHURCHES IN GEORGIA, we work with 37 AFFILIATES across 27 STATES to care for a larger number of vulnerable children across the country.

MORE THAN ENOUGH

Did you know we partner with Christian Alliance for Orphans to work toward the "More than Enough" goal? "More than Enough" is defined as 10% of churches in every county having an active Family Advocacy Ministry.


