A likable, hamburger-loving, fishing enthusiast, Christian* has lived in 8 different homes in the past 8 years. He has been in 18 schools while in foster care. Understandably, school is challenging for him.

Christian and Mark became a family last December. As a single man with no children, Mark's heart for adoption comes from his own childhood experience of having been adopted from foster care. Mark quickly realized that he could use some help.

This is when a Care Community stepped in.

Upon learning about Mark and Christian, a care community from a local church sprang into action. At first they met practical needs like helping provide for Christian's insatiable appetite for hamburgers. Soon they were organizing fishing trips where they witnessed Christian's smile grow with every fish he caught. One volunteer, a retired teacher, was happy to jump in and begin tutoring Christian. Through hard work and the support of his Care Community, he went from being in danger of not passing 10th grade to passing every single class.

As this team embraced Christian, Mark soon realized he was being embraced, too. This group of volunteers showed up with the simple willingness to meet tangible, emotional, and spiritual needs, lifting the yoke and making life a little lighter through community.




